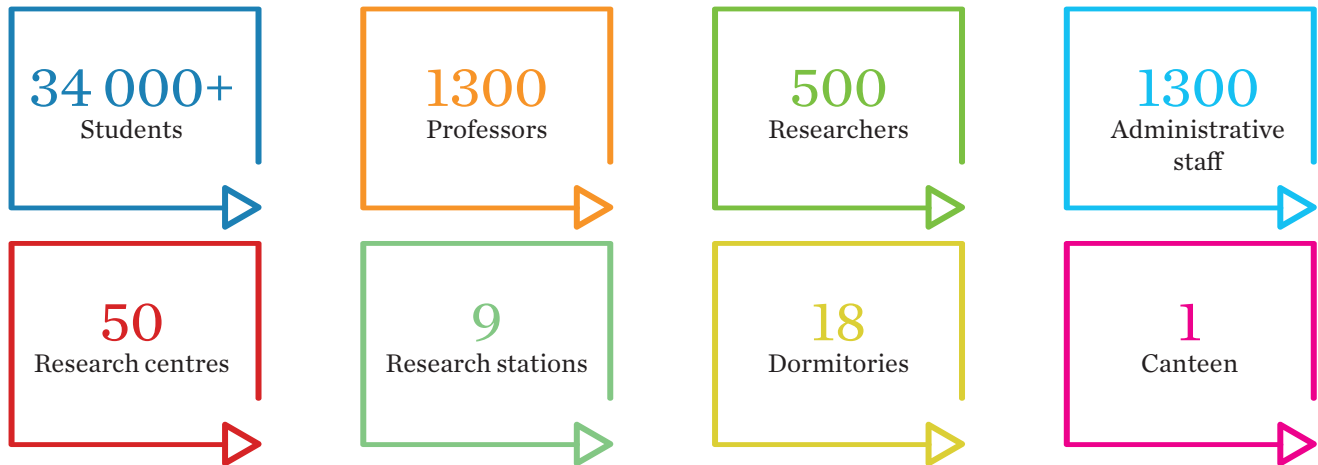
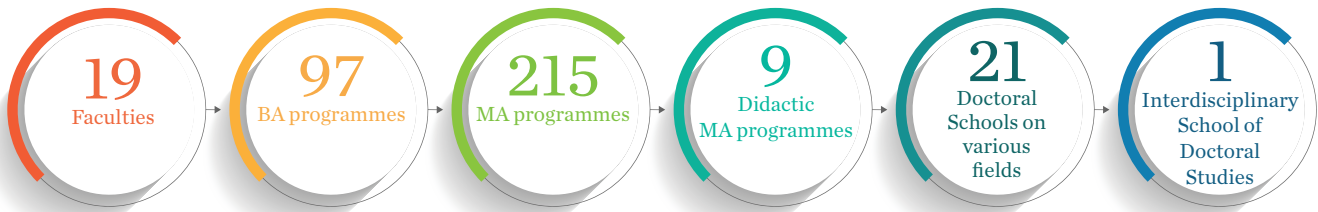
A central player in Romanian and European higher education, UB is an institution engaged in a permanent process of adaptation and internationalization, open to multiculturalism and diversity.

Admission for Non-EU Citizens

STEP 1: *Obtaining the letter of acceptance*

- ▷ In order to get the Letter of Acceptance, the candidates must send a request for admission to study at the University of Bucharest.
- ▷ The admission process will take place exclusively online. Please be sure all your documents are scanned in PDF format.
- ▷ The candidates are asked to access our online application platform: unibuc.ro

STEP 2: *Examination of candidates*

- ▷ The Office for International Cooperation and Foreign Students will inform the candidates about the exact date of evaluation, where an interview is part of the admission process.
- ▷ The candidates with the highest average will be admitted to studies, within the limit of the number of places available, in the case of admission on the basis of a file. In case of equal averages, it will be considered the mark obtained in the subject relevant to the programme applied for. In the case of specializations with other forms of assessment, please consult the academic offer and the specific criteria.
- ▷ The list of admitted candidates will be published on unibuc.ro
- ▷ Candidates declared admitted will have to confirm their place within 24 hours from the publication of the results by completing the statement confirming the place. Failure to complete the declaration will automatically result in disqualification and loss of the position, which will be filled by the candidate situated on the next position.
- ▷ Only candidates who have been admitted and have confirmed their place will receive the acceptance letter in order to start the visa process.
- ▷ The Office for International Cooperation and Foreign Students will issue to the admitted candidates, who have confirmed the place, a certificate stating the passing of the entrance exam, necessary for completing the file for obtaining the study visa.

STEP 3: *Obtaining the student visa*

Based on the Acceptance Letter (and payments, where requested) and the certificate confirming the passing of the entrance exam, applicants will have to apply for the study visa at the Romanian Embassy in their country or the closest Romanian diplomatic mission.

STEP 4: *The enrolment*

- ▷ The enrolment is possible at the Office for International Cooperation and Foreign Students only in person.
- ▷ Upon your arrival in Romania, for registration to the University of Bucharest you need to present the originals for all documents submitted online, plus:
 - ▶ letter of acceptance (original);
 - ▶ proof of payment (original) for the paying students;
 - ▶ passport and student visa;
 - ▶ 3 photos ¾ cm.

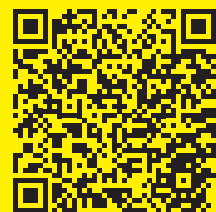

Starting with 1995, the Collège Juridique Franco-Roumain d'Études Européennes offers excellent programmes in legal education, focusing on European, Comparative and French Law. Within this Bachelor programme, the students are registered both at the University of Bucharest and Université Paris 1 Panthéon Sorbonne, having the opportunity to obtain the diploma Bachelor in Law under both Romanian and French system.

PHYSICS (in English)

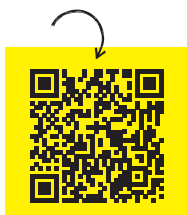

Our Bachelor of Physics provides a balanced undergraduate education in foundations of physics, including classical mechanics, electromagnetism, thermodynamics, and optics, as well as in modern physics such as quantum mechanics, condensed matter, nuclear and particle physics. The programme is designed to develop analytical, laboratory, and computational skills essential for a future career in physics such as scientific research in academia or industry, but also for physics-related domains essential to the development of a modern society (e.g. secondary education, engineering, medicine, or telecommunication). Students are encouraged to explore hands-on research in the faculty, but also in partner institutes and experience inter-university exchanges.

The programme proposes a thorough, all-encompassing approach of the history of political thinking, the functioning of political parties, the political phenomena and their developments, as well as of public life problems in Romania. It seeks to train specialists in political science, qualified to become employees on the specialty job market (central and local institutions, political parties, NGOs, mass-media), or to continue their studies with a master's programme in order to further develop their professional skill sets and abilities.

Erasmus+ funding allows students to participate in several international mobility programmes. Also, in order to help students fulfil the required internships, the faculty has established agreements with over 200 public and private institutions. The programme trains students in the spirit of professional and academic integrity, in accordance with the ethical foundations of consolidated democracies, with respect for universal human rights and individual freedom.

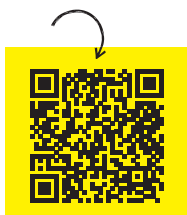

APPLIED BIOCHEMISTRY AND MOLECULAR BIOCHEMISTRY (in English)

This Master Programme is a comprehensive interdisciplinary programme, which concentrates on biochemistry molecular aspects in human, and it is designed only for students who want to work in clinical and research laboratories.

The programme is a 2-year, full-time study where students attend ten mandatory courses aimed to provide knowledge about concepts, theories and methods in biochemistry and molecular biology and allow students to acquire abilities for analysis and interpretation of the experimental results, implementation, and development of new analytic, statistic and bioinformatic methods, ensuring quality control and internal audit, high level of autonomy, and bioethics.

Available research topics for the master's programme as well as for the subsequent PhD are clustered in the field of Biomedicine, Nanotoxicology, Tissue engineering, Cellular and molecular aspects of diseases.

MASTER IN NEUROBIOLOGY (in English)

This is an interdisciplinary programme in the field of neurosciences aiming to offer theoretical and practical knowledge required to conduct advanced neuroscience research.

The programme is a 2-year, full-time study where students learn and perform hands-on experiments on subjects related to neuronal, glial and microvasculature physiology, on the integrated nervous control at the whole organism level and on the use of analytical and computational methods for interpreting their results in a broader scientific context.

The final goal of the programme is to prepare future researchers in neurobiology with the knowledge and skills which allow them to plan and implement complex neuroscience experiments, for a better understanding of the brain and the mind, the science's final frontier of the XXI century.

This programme will introduce students in the complexity of relations between humans and nature. Is a research-focused programme where you will learn how to use ecosystem approach and sustainability thinking as a way of understanding and managing social-ecological systems, contribute to the research in this field and addressing real-world problems. The programme is a 2-year, full-time study where students attend ten mandatory courses aimed at providing knowledge about concepts, theories, and methods for studying the complexities of social-ecological systems.

The students will develop and conduct their own research as the basis of their master's thesis in relation with one or more of the research themes implemented by the Department's research centres.

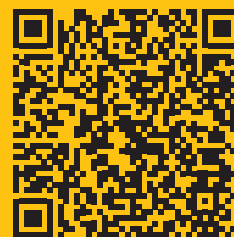


The International Relations Department

of the University of Bucharest includes two fundamental components: the ERASMUS Office and the International Cooperation and Foreign Students Office. Its mission is to coordinate and support the different forms of international cooperation in which the University of Bucharest is involved, mainly the management of academic and research exchanges with the external partner universities.

Main duties of the International Relations Department:

- counselling and monitoring of foreign students;
- counselling of foreign lecturers who teach within the University of Bucharest;
- counselling of Romanian students and academics who study or carry out research internships abroad;
- management of Erasmus mobilities (students and academics);
- management and registry of projects financed through Erasmus+ Programme;
- management of CEEPUS mobilities – foreign students and academics with CEEPUS grants;
- management of AUF “Eugen Ionescu” grants (through the Francophone University Agency).
